Darryl L. Corley Jr. is a Birmingham, Alabama native whose journey reflects perseverance, excellence, and a lifelong commitment to family, athletics, and community. A standout student-athlete at Midfield High School, Corley excelled in football, basketball, and track and field. His dominance as a defensive end earned him an athletic scholarship to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga in 2004.

In 2006, Corley returned home to Birmingham and accepted a full athletic scholarship to Miles College, where he became a standout member of the Golden Bears football program. Transitioning to defensive tackle, he established himself as a force on the defensive line. In 24 career games, Corley recorded 118 total tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, one sack, four quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles, and four fumble recoveries. His outstanding collegiate career earned him an invitation to participate in the prestigious 2009 HBCU Senior Bowl. That same year, he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration.

Corley's football accomplishments continued to open doors beyond Miles College, including an invitation to the St. Louis Rams Mini Camp in 2010.

Following his playing career, Corley built a successful professional career in operations and leadership. He spent five years as a Plant Superintendent with Alabama Metal Industries before transitioning to the transportation industry. He currently serves as a Terminal Manager with FirstFleet, where he leads transportation operations and develops teams through a commitment to accountability, excellence, and leadership.

Beyond his professional achievements, Corley remains dedicated to giving back through youth sports, coaching, and mentoring. His impact extends beyond statistics and accomplishments, reflecting the character of a student-athlete who has carried the values of teamwork, perseverance, leadership, and service from the football field into his career and community.
